t the Marist Youth Leadership Camp in Esopus over the summer, Brothers Luis Ramos, Robert Dittus, and Ryan Richter took part in a ceremony to renew their vows as Marist Brothers. Later in August, Br. David Freiler and Br. Miguel Garcia professed their first vows as Marist Brothers during a liturgy at Mount St. Michael Academy in the Bronx, NY.



Following their first vows, Br. David shared that "becoming a vowed member of a religious community is the greatest achievement of my life. I can now live out my mission with the focus and help of the Marist Brothers, the Church, and of course God." Br. Miguel elaborated by adding "in the inner-workings of our faith, we can find God completely, especially through the gentle guidance of our Good Mother Mary, who always said 'Yes.' Her example inspires us to be present and to show love in its simplest form, reminding us that just being there for others can make a profound difference. I love to always believe that God is in us, and we are in him."



Our Brothers renewing vows also had much to say about their journey as Marist Brothers. Br. Luis explained that his "renewal of vows was a happy and grounding moment. It was

a joy to share it with the Marist Youth. Having them there reminded me of the origins of my own vocation." Looking back at his first year as a professed Brother, Br. Ryan says that it "was filled with blessings, challenges, and a lot of learning.

COHORT 4 COMMITMENT CEREMONY

Mn June, thirty-six Lay Marists completed the 4th Cohort of our six-month Marists of Champagnat Formation Program. Today, we are blessed to have almost 200 Lay men and women who have now made a formal commitment as Marists here in the USA. They are dedicating their lives to our Marist Charism in real and concrete ways, including strengthening our efforts to bring forth our Marist Mission of Making Jesus Christ Known and Loved throughout our USA Province and beyond. So many of these remarkable men and women are fostering our mission in their daily lives and work.

The 5th cohort of Marists of Champagnat will begin their formation program on January 2, 2025.



VOLUNTEERING IN SOUTH AFRICA

This summer, Dorothy Denoto, one of our Marists of Champagnat, became the first USA Volunteer at our Marist Three2six project in South Africa, which is dedicated to serving the many refugee children in that country.

Ms. Dorothy DeNoto, a longtime faculty member at Archbishop Molloy High School and a Marist of Champagnat (Cohort 1), spent the end of her summer serving as an International Marist Volunteer in South Africa. She worked with the Three2six Program, a Marist project serving refugee children. Dorothy's service is a wonderful example of our global Marist charism at work and the impact Lay Marists can have worldwide. Before her trip, Dorothy shared:



"Jesus taught us to love our young people and to love them all equally. This becomes especially important when dealing with youth who are on the margins of society, such as 13-yearold refugees being

taken in by the Marists in Johannesburg, South Africa. When I found out that I was going to have the opportunity to mentor these refugees who were struggling in school, I knew immediately that this mission from God was meant to be." "My thought is to simply be Marist to each and every one of the young people under my direction, loving them all equally with compassion and acceptance! I leave tomorrow, August 12th, for South Africa. In addition to my spiritual readiness, I carry with me two symbols. One is my 'Marist of Champagnat' cross, and the other is a pair of rosary beads, blessed by Pope Francis. They were given to me by Br. Dan O'Riordan to pray with while in South Africa. I am thankful to all who made this possible, including the Marist Brothers, my school Administrators and faculty, and to my family and friends! What an incredible blessing I've been given to be able to pave the way for others in the future who may want to embark upon service throughout our world! Please pray for all those who will be sent to me from God while in Africa! Peace to

PILGRIMAGE TO L'HERMITAGE

Over the summer, twenty-nine USA and Canada Marist pilgrims (including nine Marist Young Adults and Marist Young Professionals!) traveled to Lyon, France to begin their week-long pilgrimage as part of our Province's celebration of the 200th Anniversary of the building of l'Hermitage - where Saint Marcellin Champagnat set up his first community of Marist Brothers and is still home to many Brothers today.

The pilgrimage consisted of visiting many locations with great significance to our Marist history and the life of St. Marcellin Champagnat, such as the Memorare in the Snow, The Dying Boy, La Valla, and many more. We also joined the community of Taize for their midday prayer.



DEDICATION OF FIRST EVER MARIST-OWNED SCHOOL IN LIBERIA

Over the past two years, students in our ten USA Marist schools, raised significant money to help build the first ever Marist owned school in Liberia, West Africa. In 1985, four USA Marist Brothers began our Marist mission in Liberia. Our community there has overcome and endured many struggles including civil wars and dire poverty. Through our Solidarity efforts, the building project was completed this summer and our Marist school opened its doors in September to its first students. On November 1, the school hosted a special dedication of the new school. Our USA Provincial, Br. Dan O'Riordan, attended the recent dedication.



LINK COUNCILORS VISIT TO THE USA



IN MEMORIAM

Br. Joe Herrera

Joseph
Herrera, FMS,
passed away
at the Laredo
Medical Center
in Laredo, TX
on June 18,
2024. He was

77 years old and in his 58th year of Marist religious life.

Brother Joe attended the Marist Juniorate at Esopus and Cold-Springon-Hudson, NY (1962-1965). Upon graduation, he entered the Marist Brothers Novitiate in Esopus. He received the habit on August 15, 1966 and made first profession of vows on August 15, 1967. After his first profession, he went to the Scholasticate at Marist College in Poughkeepsie, NY and graduated with a BA in Chemistry in 1970. He made his final profession of vows in Laredo, TX in 1975. Later on he did graduate studies at St. Mary's University in Texas and completed an MA in Theology in 1982.

He began his teaching career at St. Joseph Academy in Laredo, TX (1970-1973). When the school closed, he taught at J.W. Nixon High School in Laredo (1973-1984) and then went on to work as a Youth Minister for the Diocese of Corpus Christi, TX (1984-87 and 1987-1995). In 1987 he participated in the Marist Brothers Second Novitiate Renewal

Program in Fribourg, Switzerland. He returned to teach at J.W. Nixon High School in Laredo (1995-1999) and then ministered in the Youth Cursillo Retreat program of the Diocese of Laredo (1999-2002). He spent the next several years as a teacher at St. Augustine High School (2002-2007), Dr. Leonides G. Cigarroa High School (2007-2009) and Raymond and Tirza Martin High School (2009-2017), all in Laredo. Brother Joe retired from the Laredo Independent School District in June, 2017.

A faithful member of St. Martin de Porres Church, Brother Joe continued to journey with others as a spiritual director after retirement.

Br. Paul Meuten



Brother Paul Meuten, FMS, passed away peacefully at the Lawrence Hospital in Bronxville, NY on September 16, 2024. He

was 87 years old and in his 69th year of Marist Religious Life.

Brother Paul entered the Juniorate of the Marist Brothers in Furth, Germany in 1949. In 1952 he went to the International Juniorate in Grugliasco, Italy. After receiving the habit in 1955 in Bairo, Italy, he made his profession of first vows there in 1956. In the same year, he began his scholasticate at Marist (then Marian) College in Poughkeepsie, NY and received a BA in History in 1960. He made his profession of final vows at Marist College in 1961.

From 1960 to 1962 he was a teacher at Archbishop Molloy High School in Briarwood, NY, during which time he also completed an MA in History from St. John's University. From 1962 until 1979, Brother Paul served in several capacities in the Philippines. He was a teacher, high school principal, college instructor, dean, university president at the following Marist Brothers establishments: N.D. of Marbel, N.D. of Jolo College, N.D. of Kidapawan College and N.D. of Dadiangas College. He also served in the planning office of the Catholic Educational Association of the Philippines. During this time, he professed the vow of stability in 1972 in Marbel, Philippines. In 1979, he made his Second Novitiate in Fribourg, Switzerland and from 1980 to 1982 he did graduate studies at St. John's University, Queens, NY. He returned to the Philippines in 1982 to the Marist

School in Marikina City and in 1987 did a renewal program at Hawkstone Hall in the UK. From 1987 to 1990 he was at N.D. of Marbel University and then served at the Marist General House in Rome, Italy as Director and as social secretariat from 1990 to 1995.

He returned to the Philippines from 1995 to 1998 where he worked on the Philippine Library Materials Project. The Library at the University of Notre Dame of Dadiangas is named the Brother Paul Meuten Library in his honor. Brother Paul moved to Bayonne, NJ in 1998 and served as Assistant Provincial Treasurer there until his retirement in 2010. He officially transferred to the Province of the United States in 2004. In 2019, he moved to the Marist Brothers Champagnat Hall Community in the Bronx, NY, where he pursued his love of history and music right up until the time of his death.
