- Departure: July 6, 2026




FIRST CALL: To Be Builders of a Culture of Vocations




God calls us today to the Marist VOCATION and invites us to live it with passion, as true lovers of life and mission. By giving ourselves wholeheartedly, we become living witnesses of the Gospel, inspiring and accompanying others to discover and embrace their own Marist vocation. In this way, we generate, nurture and sustain the richness of all Marist vocations.

BRICKS / FOUNDATIONAL VALUES →

This call invites us to a conversion of heart and mind where we:



- Promote a holistic and vibrant culture of vocations.
- Focus on processes of authentic discernment, not mere numbers.
- Commit to vocational care, personally and communally.
- Foster creative audacity within the Institute that prioritizes vocational promotion.
- Awaken the commitment and enthusiasm of our communities for all projects related to a culture of vocations.



STRATEGIES:

As Marists of Champagnat, Brothers, and lay women and men together we stand as builders of a New Hermitage, called to raise walls of hope, open doors of welcome, and lay foundations of faith for the generations to come. Each call of this Chapter offers us a set of tools - carefully crafted and entrusted to us- not for ourselves alone, but for the flourishing of the global Marist family.

The strategies that follow are not simply plans or tasks; they are instruments for shaping a common dwelling where the Spirit breathes life.

As artisans of this shared dream, we are invited to take up these strategies with courage and creativity. May they be for us not only blueprints but also signs of communion, so that together we may build a hermitage where all feel at home, and where Christ is joyfully at the center.

1. Explore and reimagine key issues such as the identity of the brother, models of being a brother, the relationship between brothers and lay people and initial and ongoing formation.
2. Strengthen the culture of vocational care through personal and community discernment, ongoing formation, personal planning and accompaniment.
3. Develop a vocational culture across the Institute through integrated plans that use technology, social networks and best practices shared between provinces. This will promote support and meaningful engagement with young people.
4. Develop an integrated vocational culture across the Institute so that there are welcoming spaces capable of connecting with, caring for and inviting youth to follow Jesus as Marist Brothers. In collaboration with Formators and Formandeas, ensure our Formation houses are contemporary, open, and flexible.
5. Expand vocational ministry through exploring new spaces, developing networks of animators and collaborating with other Church groups.

Through Vocation, we sharpen the tools of listening and accompaniment, helping new generations discover the beauty of God's call.
